





Community Input Committee (CIC)

- Established in its current form 2024 (previously Citizens Advisory Committee (CAC)
- 19 members One member nominated by each City Council member (10), One member per Board quadrant (4)
- Intends to facilitate the flow of ideas and concerns from the community and provide input on strategic objectives, key initiatives, and other CPS Energy business activities

BOARD OVERVIEW



The Board is composed of a Trustee from each of the four quadrants of our service area and the Mayor of San Antonio, as an ex-officio member:

- New members are elected by existing Board members and confirmed by City Council
- All five members are voting positions

The Board is the governing body of San Antonio's electric and gas utility:

- Ensures future viability and prosperity
- Ensures proper performance oversight
- Authorized to make rules and regulations governing electric and gas service, including customer payment requirements


BOARD COMPOSITIONFOUR QUADRANTS



 Quadrant boundaries are determined by population to ensure each quadrant has roughly the same number of people.

BOARD AUTHORITY SOVEREIGN BOARD



- City Council has delegated all authority not reserved to City of San Antonio to manage and operate CPS Energy to the Board of Trustees.
 - Examples: budget, generation plan, supply chain procurements, and selection of President and CEO.
- This makes our Board of Trustees different than most city boards because our board is not advisory in nature. They have authority to act on behalf of the City of San Antonio.
 - The Board manages our valuable assets consistent with the long-term ownership interests of the City of San Antonio.

RESPONSIBILITIES OF TRUSTEES

CPS

ACTIVITIES THE BOARD UNDERTAKES

- Lead in partnership with the President and CEO in developing and articulating the company's vision
- Review and approve management's strategic and business plans to achieve the vision
- Establish and affirm policies that promote effective stewardship and allocation of company resources
- Ensure management succession planning
- Select, support, and develop performance standards for the President and CEO
- Understand, provide oversight and monitor the performance of the President and CEO
- Review and approve large financial transactions
- Exercise appropriate oversight regarding risk mitigation
- Set the tone for ethical behavior to preserve public confidence
- Serve the customer first among various stakeholders
- Follow all applicable laws
- Promote trust within and among stakeholders

Mayor

- Ex-Officio voting member
- Charged with duty and responsibility of keeping City Council fully informed on CPS Energy


Trustees

- Must be a permanent resident of Bexar County
- Must reside in quadrant
- Must be a U.S. Citizen
- Term is 5 years
- Eligible for one second term
- Receive \$2,000/year (Chair receives \$2,500/year)
